Standard 13 – Health and Safety



Introduction

Standard 13: Health and Safety is one of 15 Care Certificate standards you must successfully complete to be awarded the Care Certificate. These learning resources have been designed to support you with the **theoretical knowledge** that underpins each standard.

In order to achieve the standard, you will need to **demonstrate** to your assessor **the application** of the theory you have studied **in your place of work.**

In **Standard 13: Health and Safety** you will learn about the ways your employer can consult with you on health and safety matters, how to be consistent with legislation, policies and procedures, and definitions of hazard, risk and risk assessment. You will learn how to recognise common workplace hazards, how risks can be managed, how to apply and promote safe working practices and the importance of reporting health and safety concerns.
